^The candidate also qualified the English Typing Test at the speed of 30 w.p.m. and secured 59/100 marks. He attempted paper-I in Hindi stream. Hence, his marks for Hindi typing have been taken into account while preparing the result.

These candidates will have to qualify the typing test at the speed of 40 w.p.m. on computer within one year of their appointment to the post of Junior Clerk failing which they shall not be allowed to draw subsequent increments in the grade of Junior Clerk.

3. The marks secured by the other candidates who qualified the typing test are as follows:

4. The candidates having Roll Nos. 31, 46 and 79 attempted Paper-I in Hindi stream but could not qualify Typing Test in the required Hindi stream. All the three candidates qualified the Typing Test in English stream. The answer sheets of Paper-I of the candidates having Roll Nos. 31 and 79 have not been got evaluated. The candidate having Roll No. 46 could not qualify the Hindi Typing Test by a very thin margin. He

typed 1499 net strokes as against the required 1500 strokes. His answer sheet of Paper-I was got evaluated for consideration of his case by the Competent Authority at the time of finalization of the result. He secured 71 marks therein. However, at the time of preparation of result, it was found that his overall merit would be lower than the last candidate who has been selected against UR vacancy.

5. The remaining candidates who appeared in the typing test could not qualify the same. Their answer sheets for Paper-I: Essay, Letter and Grammar have not been got evaluated.
