**Subject: Final result of Competitive Departmental Examination against Direct Recruitment Quota for filling up of vacancies for the post of Parliamentary Reporter Grade-II in Lok Sabha Secretariat (Circular No. 30192 dated 12.05.2016)**

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Circular No. 30192 was issued on 12.05.2016 for holding Departmental Examination for filling up 13 vacancies (07 UR; 03 OBC; 02 SC & 01 ST) (07 in English stream and 06 in Hindi stream) for the post of Parliamentary Reporter Gd. - II in Lok Sabha Secretariat.

2. On the basis of the performance in Stenography Tests, Written Test and Personal Interview held on 18.06.2016, 02.07.2016 and 03.07.2016, respectively, the candidates having the following Roll Nos. have been declared successful:-

3. The candidates having Roll Nos. 01, 09, 10, 26 and 41 have cleared the Written Test (each component/part and aggregate) and the Personal Interview as per the prescribed criteria of 50% for UR vacancies and 45% for OBC vacancies and the Stenography Test at speed of 140 w.p.m. They should qualify the Stenography Test at the speed of 160 w.p.m. within a year of their appointment failing which they shall not be granted annual increment and their confirmation in the grade deferred.

In the Circular No. 30192, it was also mentioned that those candidates who obtain not less than 50% of the qualifying marks in the Written Test may also be considered for conditional appointment. Though the candidate having Roll No. 34 could not secure the prescribed 45% marks (for OBC vacancy) in each component of the Written Test, the marks secured by him were sufficient to consider him for conditional appointment in this regard. He has also qualified the Stenography Test at the speed of 140 w.p.m. He shall qualify the Written Test with minimum 45% marks in each component and also the Stenography Test at the speed of 160 w.p.m. within a year of his appointment failing which he shall not be granted annual increment and his confirmation in the grade deferred.

5. The attention of candidates is, however, drawn to the following declaration made by them in their applications to the above said post:

*"I hereby declare that I fulfil the eligibility conditions laid down in the Joint Recruitment Cell's Circular No. 30192 dated 12<sup>th</sup> May, 2016 for the Departmental Examination for the post of Parliamentary Reporter Grade-II(English/Hindi). In the event of this declaration of mine being found false at a later date at any stage, my candidature/appointment is liable to be cancelled/terminated and I render*

*myself liable for disciplinary action as per rules applicable to the employees of Lok Sabha Secretariat."*

6. In the Call Letter issued to the candidates, the following was mentioned:

*"12. Your candidature is provisional and your candidature/appointment to the said post can be cancelled/terminated at any stage/at any time, in case any declaration in your application or any information/document furnished by you does not match with the requirements in accordance with the eligibility conditions detailed in circular 30192 dated 12.05.2016 for the above said competitive departmental examination. You are therefore, required to satisfy yourself that you fulfill the eligibility conditions in accordance with the said circular, before attending the examination.*

The above candidates failed in the Stenography Test at the speed of 160 w.p.m. The remaining candidates who appeared in the said Departmental Examination failed in the Stenography Tests at the speeds of 140 w.p.m. and 160 w.p.m. They committed more than the maximum number of admissible errors i.e. 5% in the Stenography Tests.
