




Excreta is harmful

 One gram of excreta can contain: 1,00,00,000 viruses 10,00,000 bacteria 1,000 parasite cysts 100 parasite eggs


Water, Sanitation and Poverty

'Sanitation vital for poverty reduction'


 US\$1 invested in water and sanitation would give an economic return of between US\$3 and US\$34, depending on the region (WHO)

Sanitation Crisis

- Daily 1000 child deaths alone under five from diarrhoea
- Every second child is malnourished
- High Infant Mortality 57 per 1000 live birth
- One out of five persons without toilet lives in India: 500million
- 55% still defecate in open, 74% in rural areas and 17% in urban areas (NFHS-III, 2005-2006)
- Urban slums most disadvantaged in accessing safe sanitation facilities
- 35 % of schools still do not have access to sanitation facilities
- Women harassment/dignity, high drop out rate among girls
- About 115 million MT unmanaged waste annually: global warming
- Rs 1200 crore income loss, 180 million loss of man days






India's share of global challenge...




Two India's: Economic progress and gap in social indicator




Progress in Rural Water Supply

- Focus on women and children as change agents
- Availability of affordable toilet options



- Operational for the last three years




Sanitation is achievable!



- Good progress in the last few years
- Fund commitment up to 13,000 crore
- 584 districts are covered under TSC
- NGP- PRIs 5700
- 30,000 applications this year
- Three States Andhra, TN, and WB already achieved MDG

Way Forward Next Generation Sanitation Initiatives

 Solid and Liquid Waste Management

- Methane farming for energy use
- Waste plastic as fuel
- Urine Farming





Travel and Tourism Industry

- Inadequate sanitation infrastructure at tourist places as well as highways
 - Poor hygiene practices in <u>food</u> <u>outlets</u>
 - Example-Thailand model, STEP in Kerala, Haveli-Punjab
- Petrol Pumps
 - No uniform standards for facilities
 - Not gender friendly, no separate unit
 - No or inadequate maintenance
 - Design not suited to condition/culture



Sanitation and rights of the children

- Sanitation is essential to reduce child mortality and morbidity
- No children should get involved in scavenging and cleaning jobs:
 - Railway station and trains
 - Bus stands
 - Garbage collection in cities
 - Dhaba / restaurants / Canteens

Challenges are still there.....

- Still a taboo and Stigma (like HIV/AIDS in the 1980s)
- Low priority, not as glamorous as other sectors
- Behavioural barriers benefits not widely understood
- Scale of the problem is daunting (55% open defecation)
- Urban and rural issues
- Rich/poor disparities
- Issues of sustainability, quality facilities and hygiene promotion
- sanitation and waste management as revenue and employment generating opportunities
- Addressing issues of global warming and earning carbon credits

International Year of Sanitation: a great opportunity



- Organise a special joint session of parliament/ State Assembly on sanitation and hygiene
- Active support for preventing open defecation in respective constituencies, states.
- Public pledge by all elected representatives including PRIs and public servants to ensure toilets at home
- Advocate for well maintained, sanitation and hygiene facilities in schools/ public places; gender/disabled friendly toilets

International Year of Sanitation a great opportunity



- Promotion of hygiene (especially hand washing) and cleanliness
- Advocate for more/continued support to TSC and NGP at national, state, and district level
- Create mechanism for strong monitoring of programme, proper fund and speedy utilization
